A Message From Your Pastor:

I've done a lot of traveling in North Carolina. In particular, I have traveled a great deal around the border of the town of Thomasville, but never through it. I've had business in High Point, Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Lexington, and even Archdale, but never Thomasville; until January of this year. And I have met some of the most wonderful people here at Fair Grove Church.

Not only are the people here amongst the sweetest and kindest that I have ever met, but one of the most Holy Spirit filled churches that I have had the privilege of being a part of. The first day I set foot here, I was met by someone who proceeded to give the "lay of the land" so to speak, of the Church family. She told me nothing of the politics of the church. She told me nothing of the history of the church. She told me nothing of the different families and their legacies here. She told me nothing of who to listen to or avoid. She told me nothing of how things were done here, or what I could expect from the members of the church. And neither did she express any information about past ministers, good or bad, Instead, she sat right down and told me what Jesus was doing in Fair Grove.

She told me of prayers that had gone up in anticipation of a new pastor. She told me how the Holy Spirit was working not at, but IN Fair Grove. She told me briefly about a church that had been through some hard times, but was turning the corner to recovery and that it was through the Holy Spirit that the light was beginning to shine in this community again. She told me nothing of what I expected to hear and EVERYTHING I needed to hear about the spiritual condition of Fair Grove.

I tell you this not only to reference this lady and her zeal for Fair Grove Church, but to lay the ground-work for this next statement: I have had similar conversations with nearly every person that I've met with or talked to since my first day here. I have had conversations with Church members and community members about the Spiritual Life of this church and this community.

Let me pause right here and let that sink in a church whose members are concerned about the spiritual life of their church. That is or that should be every minister's dream! In my early assessment of Fair Grove, this is what I see: I see people hungry for God's Word. I see people concerned about the unsaved. I see people who are prayerful. I see people who are going on to perfection. And I see precious souls from the oldest adult to the youngest child excited about what God is doing.

Fair Grove Church is the epitome of Matthew 5:14-16; "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."



All women are invited to attend this event.




