A Message From Pastor Mark:

Authority: The Heart of Human Decision

In the 4th chapter of Acts, a book which I feel is amongst the most exciting books in the Bible, there is one of many incidents where one or more of the disciples were brought before the Jewish leaders and questioned. This happened frequently especially immediately following the resurrection of Jesus due to the fact that the followers of Jesus were seen as a proposed threat to the Roman Emperor.

In Jewish times, as today, authority is important. Who we follow is important. The decisions we make based on who is our authority are important. And in this situation with Peter and John, we find that they were about to be arrested because those IN charge, the leaders and the rulers, did not like having THEIR authority usurped.

So in chapter 4 we have Peter and John brought before Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, and others elders and teachers of the Law. What is so interesting about this first encounter between the Disciples and the Jewish leaders is the accusation that faced Peter and John. Witnessing a man who was healed by Peter and John, the Jewish leaders asked them. "By what power or what name did you do this?" No praise for healing a man who was supposedly in his 50's; no accolades; no "how did you do that?" Instead, they wanted to know, "By whose authority did you do this?"

In this world, we are inundated with groups, governments, and people "in charge" who believe that their way is right: period! And the range of right and wrong varies to the point that no one really knows anymore what is right or wrong. So who do we follow? Where do we place our allegiance? Like sheep following their shepherd, what influences our choices?

Believe it or not, that should be a simple choice. But today it is not. Why? The majority believe in Jesus. But are they really ready to submit to His Kingship as His servant? Do they really believe Jesus holds the keys to heaven and hell. do they believe in the authority of His word written in the Bible? Do they really believe He is the Lord and we, His church, are His bride? In this world, there is, has been, and for the near foreseeable future, will be only two choices of authority. You guessed it: Jesus and Satan, Heaven or hell. Now the Heaven or hell part of course does concern eternity and where we will spend it. But its much more than that. Who is your master? Jesus offers Heaven. Satan offers hell. And Hell is NOT a "big party, Dude!" Hell is suffering, damnation, darkness forever. No choices after death.

So regarding the Disciples, when posed with the question "By who's authority did you heal this man?", "Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: "Rulers and elders of the people! If we are being called to account today for an act of kindness shown to a man who was lame and are being asked how he was healed, then know this, you and all the people of Israel: It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed. Jesus is "the stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone.' Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved."

All authority on earth falls under two realms, God and Satan, resulting in two different destinations, Heaven or hell. And sadly, most people don't seem to recognize this. Their ability and information which they use to make decisions is determined by a corrupt world, not only heavily influenced by Satan, but controlled by Satan. And even sadder still, even some of those to whom authority is given in this world aren't aware of it.

But you are not one of those. You know there is a Godly authority and there is a Satanic authority. You are God's sheep. You follow the voice of God's shepherd who is a good, kind, and loving shepherd and all will be well. However, there are evil shepherds in our world today. These shepherds are wolves in sheep's clothing who seek to lead you into Satan's pasture. Don't fall for their lies. Think, reason, and make decisions based on the truths of the Bible. Follow the words of our Lord Jesus Christ who defeated Satan. Stay with Christ the prince of truth — not Satan the prince of lies.

- Homeless Shelter We have been super busy with the women and children's homeless shelter here at the Father's Storehouse. We currently have five children and 14 women living here. You are changing lives friends!!
- * Plumbing unfortunately, the old pipes of this building are not too happy with all of the showers and toilets being used so much. We have had a plumber out every week in January and February. Please consider giving extra to help us cover these costs. We cannot do a permanent repair of the pipes until the new showers are up and running for us to have an alternate bathroom source.
- * Gift cards small increment gift cards gives these ladies the "right" to go into a fast food restaurant and sit down to rest or have a bite to eat in peace. Thank you to those of you who have donated cards. If anyone else would like to donate a card, we would appreciate it more than you know. You can stick it in the mail to us or drop it by on a Monday between 9:30am and 12:30pm. \$10-15 is the recommended amount.




