Mark's Message

Have you ever thought about how all the decisions that you've made and how all of the choices you have made throughout your life have brought you here to this moment? Now if you are like me, you've made some mistakes. For years, I have regretted some of the things that I have done, wishing I had made different choices. That is the benefit of hindsight. However, it is impossible to go back and correct the decisions I made. Because if we could go back and change just one thing, it would have ramifications that would involve and affect everyone in our lives.

There is a popular movie, in fact, three movies called Back To The Future. A scientist builds a time machine and is able to go back to the past, but when he does, one little change to something that happened in the past causes chaos for his present world. And then there are a series of trips back to the past to try and correct the mess that was made.

In our lives, we are going to make mistakes because it comes with being human. We glory in the fact that we are free moral agents and can decide things for ourselves and make choices that would benefit us the most. However, because we are human, we are imperfect, therefore, our decisions won't always be the best choice.

One of the things that set Jesus apart other than the fact that He was the Son of God, was His ability to make good moral choices. Remember, he was fully human, so His decision-making process developed just like yours and mine. But what was different about Him was the fact that from a very young age, he relied heavily on God to guide His path and His decisions. Now understand that we have access to God just like He did. But He was very adamant about the fact that He relied on the Spirit's leading. In fact, he considered His access to God to be such that in John 10:30, Jesus plainly said, "I and the Father are one." And then, there is the warning in John 15 where he tells us. "Remain in Me AS I remain in you!" And the last thing Jesus tells us that Matthew records is simply, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Jesus promised to be with us always. So when we feel like God is absent, it is us who have moved.

In Revelation 3:20, Jesus said, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come into him, and will sup with him, and he with me."

There are three things to remember. First, we need to remain in Jesus as (or in the same way as) he remains in us. Second, when Jesus is trying to get our attention, we must be in a mental and spiritual state in order to hear His voice (that means constantly being connected to Him through the Holy Spirit). And third, we must open the door and let him in. In other words, we need to Remain in Him, Recognize Him, and Respond to Him.

We are here to do the will of God. We have been brought to this point in our lives to serve Him. We must (and I am preaching to myself when I say this) follow Paul's teaching and example that he gave us in Philippians 3:13-14, "But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."




